During the academic year, the Institute has strictly adhered to the academic calendar set forth by the KTU.

Course/Class committees including faculty and student representatives are formed in accordance with university norms. In addition students are required to obtain activity points through participation in co-curricular and extracurricular activities. #### 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Institution has been steadfast in its commitment to support students from diverse backgrounds, particularly those from economically backward families. Student Performance Enhancement and

Counselling (SPEAC) cell has been instrumental in identifying slow learners. For slow learners, remedial measures are suggested, while advanced learners are provided with add-on courses, minor programs, entrepreneurship-related activities.

In the past year, SPEAC has initiated a weekly activity program. Teachers assign activities to students on a daily basis, and class tutors collect these activity reports from each teacher. These reports are then consolidated and submitted to the HoD. For preadmission students, the institution continues to provide classes in maths, chemistry, physics, and communication to improve the learning level of students.

During the induction program, for the first year group discussions, debates, familiarising of science subjects were conducted. These sessions, which involve numerous group activities, help the teachers assess the learning level of the students. Feedback from subject teachers are used to identify the advanced learners and slow learners in the higher semesters. Through mentoring, the learning ability of the mentees is identified by the mentors, based on their academic performance, social and psychological aspects, and behaviour. Remedial classes are provided for the students

- 1. Academic Calendar: UEC prepares the academic calendar in line with the KTU academic calendar. This calendar charts the specific dates for the completion of syllabus coverage, and the conduct of Continuous Assessments (CA's) for theory and laboratory.
- 2. Internal Examinations: Internal examinations are conducted by the institution strictly as per thefrequency and schedule prescribed by the university.
- 3. Question Paper Preparation and Verification: 2 sets of question papers are prepared by the faculty. Thesequestion papers are scrutinized and verified by a committee comprising of subject expert, and HoD to ensure the quality of the question paper.
- 4. Valuation Scheme: A valuation scheme isshared with the students, so that they have clarity on the marks awarded to them.

Over the past year, UEC has continued to uphold its commitment to a transparent, time-bound, and efficient internal evaluation system. Institute has conducted two series tests, in addition to tutorials and assignments, to evaluate the academic progress of our students. The College Student's Grievance and Redressal Committee, comprising the senior-most member of the institution as convener, student and faculty members from each department.

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Students have been encouraged to approach their respective faculty or mentor for any complaints or grievances related to valuation. In the class and course committee meetings, students have had the opportunity to share their grievances with the tutor, faculties, and HoD. Complaints received based on university examinations, certificates, schedule of valuation, and mark sheets have been addressed at the University level and monitored through proper channels to ensure a satisfactory outcome. #### 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The institution continues to maintain and enhance its infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. The campus comprises five academic blocks (main block, A, B, lab block, and lab annex) and one non-academic block.

Theinstitution has infrastructural facilities for conducting placement drives, rooms for IEDC, NSS, and ENCON CLUB. All laboratory facilities prescribed by the university are available and are well-maintained by the respective parentdepartments.

Inaddition to the prescribed laboratory facilities, the institution has afacility set up by the Skill Development Platform Kerala (SDPK). This facility, equipped with an interactive display, audio system, sound-sensing camera, andmic, facilitates online interactive sessions for students.

TheCivil Engineering department offers consultancy work for testing buildingmaterials and checking water quality. The institution is equipped with sevenscanning machines, 46 printers, and fax facilities. To ensure a reliable powersupply, an 80 KVA diesel generator set is installed for campus load and thegirls hostel.

For aninteractive mode of teaching-learning process, the institution has ICT-enabledsmart classroom facilities. There are two open wells, one exclusively for thegirls hostel and the other for the college, gardening, and landscaping area.

#### 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

### 2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Institution has been steadfast in its commitment to support students from diverse backgrounds, particularly those from economically backward families. Student Performance Enhancement and Counselling (SPEAC) cell has been instrumental in identifying slow learners. For slow learners, remedial measures are suggested, while advanced learners are provided with add-on courses, minor programs, entrepreneurship-related activities.

In the past year, SPEAC has initiated a weekly activity program. Teachers assign activities to students on a daily basis, and class tutors collect these activity reports from each teacher. These reports are then consolidated and submitted to the HoD. For pre-admission students, the institution continues to provide classes in maths, chemistry, physics, and communication to improve the learning level of students.

During the induction program, for the first year group discussions, debates, familiarising of science subjects were conducted. These sessions, which involve numerous group activities, help the teachers assess the learning level of the students. Feedback from subject teachers are used to identify the advanced learners and slow learners in the higher semesters. Through mentoring, the learning ability of the mentees is identified by the mentors, based on their academic performance, social and psychological aspects, and behaviour. Remedial classes are provided for the students

### 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The institution continues to maintain and enhance its infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. The campus comprises five academic blocks (main block, A, B, lab block, and lab annex) and one non-academic block.

Theinstitution has infrastructural facilities for conducting placement drives, rooms for IEDC, NSS, and ENCON CLUB. All laboratory facilities prescribed by the university are available and are well-maintained by the respective parentdepartments.

Inaddition to the prescribed laboratory facilities, the institution has afacility set up by the Skill Development Platform Kerala (SDPK). This facility, equipped with an interactive display, audio system, sound-sensing camera, andmic, facilitates online interactive sessions for students.

TheCivil Engineering department offers consultancy work for testing buildingmaterials and checking water quality. The institution is equipped with sevenscanning machines, 46 printers, and fax facilities. To ensure a reliable powersupply, an 80 KVA diesel generator set is installed for campus load and thegirls hostel.

For aninteractive mode of teaching-learning process, the institution has ICT-enabledsmart classroom facilities. There are two open wells, one exclusively for thegirls hostel and the other for the college, gardening, and landscaping area.

1. Innovations in Teaching -

Project-Based Learning (PBL)
